Instructions for Spelling, Tables and Reading Homework: Year 3



Dear Parents,

Could you please remember the following things to assist your child's completion of homework

- 1. <u>Diary</u>: Sign and check your child's diary Monday to Thursday. Write any homework messages in it regarding homework.
- 2. <u>Homework Books (Spelling and Mathematics)</u>: Please make sure that your child rules up correctly in red pencil.
- 3. <u>Ruling up:</u> Two double lines at the top and a margin down the middle in red pencil. No left margin, please. Include Spelling list and Tables number with the date as headings inside the double lines.
- 4. <u>Spelling List:</u> Could a parent or an adult call out the list words and the child writes them down neatly in the spelling book. Parents please check and sign. The child needs to use <u>red</u> and <u>black</u> to spell the words.
- 5. <u>Reading Homework</u>: Please listen to your child read aloud and follow the pages with them. Sign their reading log and write down the pages read. The reading clipboard should contain the reading log signed and the book.
- 6. <u>Homework</u> is to be placed in their homework bag to be sorted out the next day at school.

*Test Books are sent home every Monday (Tuesdays if there is a long weekend). Parents are encouraged to sign and comment on the work in the Test book.


Please return the Test Book on the following day.

Year 3 Classroom Behaviour Consequences System

Our school has introduced a whole school approach to behaviour management. The **Levels of Behaviour Framework** explicitly teaches children acceptable behaviour.

The **Year 3** class has formed a **Statement of Intent**, which explains the reasons why they come to school.

We come to school to "Make Jesus Real", to learn, be honest and play with our friends every day.

The 4 levels of behaviour descriptors and their consequences are listed below.

Colour	Consequences
Green Level of Behaviour	 Fun with classmates and friends A smile, encouragement, "thank you", praise. House tokens. Class reward system. Certificate at Assembly. See Mr Bienkowski with special work.
Yellow Level of Behaviour	 Adult check in: "The look". !1. Green Behaviour request. 2. Reminder signal from an adult. 3. Verbal Behaviour warning (3rd Reminder).
Orange Level of Behaviour	 After 3rd reminder: Adult check in: move to
Red Level of Behaviour	 Admin Referral: Principal or AP check-in with teacher. Withdrawal from class to work in Admin for a period of time. Parent contact.
