School Statement

St Joseph's School, a co-educational Catholic primary school with a current enrolment of 160 students from Kindy to Year 7, serves the Parish community of St Patrick's Waroona. The school is an integral part of the Waroona Catholic community. The School endeavours to nurture all children to grow as confident, independent, lifelong learners who are enabled to contribute to society with dignity, respect and a spirit of service.

The school promotes excellence in all of its activities, including a comprehensive literacy program with thorough support mechanisms, a thorough and methodical mathematics program that includes the Extending Mathematical Understanding (EMU) program. All classrooms are equipped with Smartboard technology and computers to support dynamic teaching and learning environments. Students throughout the school are involved in the Bluearth program, physical education activities, music and chess club. The Student Council is an active group, assisting in fund-raising events and the Safety Club. Students represent the school in athletics and swimming carnivals in the Bunbury area. The enthusiastic parent body is represented by the Parents and Friends' Association with strong support from the School Board.

By law, students must attend a minimum of 90 percent of the available school days. The overall student attendance rate for 2010 was 93%. The student attendance rate per class for 2010 was:




