Pre-Primary Newsletter

This term the Pre Primaries chose their own learning areas for **Investigation** time. They have had plenty of fun exploring and discovering like real scientists in our Science Corner and caring for animals like real vets in our Veterinary Clinic.















In the Science Corner we have made 'rain clouds' using water, shaving cream and food colouring, and watched the state of objects change when we made water bead stress balls. We have also learned about dinosaurs and dinosaur eggs by uncovering baby dinosaur bones like palaeontologists. The PPs have even made up their very own science experiments, making predictions about what will happen along with their reasons why. They have used critical thinking during these spontaneous experiences to explore cause and effect, and have found out some pretty interesting things... such as mixing a cup of tea with bi-carb and vinegar will make it fizzy like a soft

drink, but it definitely doesn't smell as tasty!

The PPs have loved role playing in the Vet Corner. There have been a few emergencies on our hands but our PP vet surgeons, assistants and even the admin staff have all remained cool, calm and collected. We are yet to have any casualties, thank goodness! We can definitely see who the animal lovers are!







We have also enjoyed getting creative and a little bit messy during Art activities!



Lastly, the PPs have learned so much in Maths and English! They have been playing hands on games where the children use the counting on strategy to help them add their score up during bowling and quoits games, they have practised telling the time through What's the Time Mr Wolf and Interactive Whiteboard games, they have even been writing recounts and practising their digraphs and sight

words through snap and hide and seek games. We have had a very busy term;

I hope you have enjoyed reading a bit about what we have been getting up to!
