SCHOOL NEWS

<u>P&F/School Board Meeting:</u> The first meeting for both of these committees will be held on Tuesday 13 February. The P&F meeting, which commences at 7.00pm, will be held in the school Library. All members of our community are welcome to attend this P&F meeting and all subsequent meetings for the year.

The School Board is an elected group of parents who will commence their meeting at 5.00pm in the Staffroom.

<u>Homework:</u> The School's Homework Policy was recently updated in order to offer a consistent approach across PP – Year 6. We have decided to offer an incentive for students to complete their homework each night; however, it will also involve the cooperation of parents. We ask that you read the following information carefully:

- Twice per term, students who have completed all homework will be rewarded with a certificate at morning briefing and an icy pole at lunch time.
- The class with the biggest percentage of students who earned certificates will also win a class reward.
- All homework must be completed to get a tick i.e. Reading Log, Spelling, Maths Basic Facts and Diary signed by a parent.
- All four aspects must be completed to achieve a tick.

PP - Yr. 3

- Homework will be checked daily by a staff member and will be recorded with a tick for completion or cross if not completed.
- Students who have five or more crosses next to their name due to not completing homework will not receive the reward.

Yr. 4 - Yr. 6

- Homework will be checked weekly by a staff member and will be recorded with a tick for completion or cross if not completed.
- Students who have two or more crosses next to their name due to not completing homework will not receive the reward.
- This will be discussed in more detail at the parent information evening.



PARKING REMINDERS

Parking at school is first and foremost a safety issue above that of any convenience factors.

- All drivers are advised not to park in the driveway of the school car park, directly behind the Church, or across the back of car bays in the staff car park. Such parking practice is problematic and dangerous in terms of visibility and when large delivery vehicles need to come in.
- Please be vigilant when parking and departing from Hesse Street. Drivers are reminded not to park within 2m of the corner.
- Please note that there is a fire hydrant on Millar Street, in front of the school office, marked by a white 'H' on the road. You are reminded vehicles should not be parked within one metre of the hydrant.
- Drivers are encouraged to park in the car park at the Town Oval and walk across to the school.
- Parking adjacent to the school office is to be either side of the Senior Citizens door only. Parking in front of the door prevents them from opening the door outwards and therefore stops them from having access to the building.


UNIFORM SHOP


