Parking Reminder: To ensure the safety of all students and parents, could the following parking protocols please be adhered to:

- Parents are advised not to park in the staff car park at drop off or pick up time, park in the driveway of the staff car park, directly behind the Church, or across the back of the staff car bays. This is to reduce visibility problems when large delivery vehicles need to gain access.
- Please be vigilant when parking and departing from Hesse Street. Drivers are reminded not to park within 2m of the corner and to reverse park on the Eastern side of the street.
- Please note there is a fire hydrant on Millar Street, in front of the school office, marked by a white 'H' on the road. You are reminded vehicles should not be parked within 1m of the hydrant.
- Drivers are encouraged to park in the car park across the road and walk to the school.


