Congratulations to Nash on such a wonderful achievement. Maybe we should start getting his autograph now!!





Help us find you in an emergency

Pinpointing your exact location can become difficult in an emergency situation. The St John First Responder App sends your GPS coordinates to the operator when you call Triple 000 for an ambulance, speeding up the time it takes to confirm your location and dispatch and ambulance.

Over 130,000 Western Australians have downloaded the app which also contains a number of other resources, including:

- First aid instruction guides helping you to treat a range of injuries and illnesses.
- Defibrillator (AED) locator showing all the defibrillator locations near you.
- Upload the location of new defibrillator (AED) locations that aren't currently appearing on the app.
- Locate nearest medical centres and emergency departments including live ED waiting time information.
- Patient transport services information.
- Your first aid course information and refresher reminder notices
- First aid tips and special offers keeping you up to date with handy first aid information.

Help others in an emergency situation

The St John First Responder app allows qualified first aiders in Western Australia to sign up and become a registered first responder. If a nearby emergency occurs (in a public place within 500 meters), you will be notified and given the opportunity to assist until the ambulance arrives.

To become a first responder you will need to provide evidence of having completed a first aid course within the last three years. Minimum qualification level of HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation. We now offer the ability to become a BASIC level first responder in the app, by uploading your Photo ID.

St John First Responder is a free app and available on <u>Apple's App Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u>. You can find out more about how to use the app in our <u>First Aid Responder App Guide</u>.

SciTech Alcoa Family Maths Night


We were very lucky to have SciTech come to our school on Monday to present a maths murder mystery.
