**Reports:** As outlined earlier this year, our school reports have been modified to reflect some recent changes and will show your child's progress in relation to the Western Australian Curriculum for their year level. The achievement standard describes an expected level that the majority of students within WA are achieving or working towards by the end of that year of schooling. Some students will have progressed beyond the achievement standard; others will require additional support. The expected standard for each year is described as 'C' or Satisfactory. It is important to focus on, and celebrate the Work Scale (effort) your child has shown in their schoolwork. Reports will be available to access digitally on Wednesday.

**Fun Day:** On Friday 11th December we will celebrate with an End of Term Mass and pray for God's care and support over the Christmas Holidays. Our students will also celebrate with a water fun day. Our Juniors (PP to 2) will remain onsite and our Seniors (3 to 6) will travel by bus to Drakesbrook Weir for land and water-based activities. Please remember to sign the permission slip for Year 3 to 6. They need to wear enclosed footwear that can get wet to ensure their feet are not cut by underwater items.

**COVID-19:** At all school events, please ensure social distancing is maintained by adults. Please do not attend if you are unwell and practice good hygiene. Additionally, if your child is unwell please do not attend school so we can also stop the spread of colds and illnesses. Please help everyone stay Covid-safe. 
