All parents who enrol their children at St Joseph's School agree to dress their children in the recognised uniform. Parents who enrol their children at St Joseph's School are required to support the school's efforts by maintaining well-fitting uniforms and supplying correct footwear, as these items are basic to the continued high standard of dress we wish to keep. It is the expectation of the school that parents provide their fullest support for these guidelines and that they will ensure their children are dressed appropriately when they leave for school each day.

If a student does not adhere to the Uniform and Grooming Policy or meet the school's expectations, then they will be asked to adjust within a negotiated time frame. This will be communicated via a Uniform Infringement Note sent home by the school. If the uniform infringement is repeated, the parents will be asked to see the Principal. If an accident or problem prevents a child from wearing the full uniform on any particular day, parents need to send a note of explanation to the classroom teacher.

- Hair for all students must be clean, neat and tidy at all times. All shoulder length or longer hair that touches the collar or can hang over the face must be tied and pinned back. The fringe is not to fall over the eyebrows. Hair must be no shorter than an electric comb setting of number 2.
- Hair must be cut in a conventional style. Hair colour is not permitted and must be natural. It is at the Principal's discretion what constitutes a conventional or extreme hair style. If in doubt consult the school before making any changes to hair.

- Hair ribbons/head bands must be in the school colours of royal blue or gold or purchased from the school uniform shop.
- No make-up or nail polish is permitted. Children are not to graffiti or draw on hands or any body parts.
- Jewellery:
 - Students are permitted to wear a chain with a religious symbol.
 - Wrist watches may be worn at owner's risk.
 - Earrings must have one simple stud or sleeper per ear lobe.
 - Both ears must have a matching stud or sleeper if earrings are being worn.
 - **NO** other jewellery is to be worn.
- The school backpack is the only allowed school bag from Pre Primary to Year 6.
- Kindy children do not have to wear a uniform but may wear the school Kindy T-shirt if they wish.
- Pre Primary, Year 1 and Year 2 students are required to wear their Sports Uniform everyday. For the duration of 2019/2020 whilst the school transitions to new uniforms, the Year 1 & 2 students can wear **either** their formal or Sports uniform (this includes both old and new style sports uniforms). Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 must wear the formal uniform on 3 days and the Sports uniform on the remaining 2 days. A Sports T-shirt roster will be supplied.
- All items of clothing must have the student's name written on the inside of the item in a visible place.
- Summer uniform is to be worn in Terms One and Four; Winter Uniform in Terms Two and Three – with a three week change-over period allowed at the beginning of each season.
- Students are expected to be attired in correct, complete school uniform (do not mix and match between formal and sports uniforms). Students are to wear their uniform with pride and must be clean and neat at all times. School blue shirts must be tucked in during class times.
- Dress/skirt length must fall just above the knee.
- School Hat must be worn during breaks or when children are involved in outside activities with the flap out. Refer to the school Sun Smart Policy.
- A correctly knotted tie must be worn in winter for both boys and girls.
- School shoes:
 - Sports shoes must be majority white and must be sports shoes (not "street shoes"). Kindy – Yr 2 Students may have Velcro, and Yrs 3 - 6 must have white laces.
 - Yrs 3 – 6 Students must wear black lace up leather school shoes with the formal uniform (no Velcro or "Mary-Jane" style shoes with buckles).
 - Shoes with heels in excess of 2cm are not permitted.
 - Boots are not permitted.
- The old style blue rain jackets are an optional extra and may not be worn during class time.
- Sports shirts must be tucked in when the old style Sports Track top is worn. House shirts are to be worn for House events. Either school polo or House shirts may be worn for a Sport lesson, as specified by the class teacher. School polo sports shirts are to be worn on excursions when sport uniform is required (not house shirts).
- Graduation shirts may be worn by Year 6 students in place of the school polo sport shirt at school. At the discretion of the Principal, Year 6 students may, on occasion, wear the graduation shirts for offsite events.
