Week 1 We are learning that people show love and forgiveness	Sometimes those who are responsible for caring for people have to show their love by saying no.  Chat with an adult in your household and explore reasons why they sometimes show their love by saying 'no.'	Love sometimes requires those responsible for caring for others to make people do things which may be unpleasant but is for their own good (eg the dentist, early bedtime, eat vegetables). Design a poster to encourage someone to do something they might not like to do, but is good for them.	People love others when they forgive those who have hurt them, treated them badly or offended them. In this way, they show mercy and love. Week 2 We are learning that God always forgives and that Jesus forgives and shows mercy	Jesus showed he had the power to forgive sins when he cured the paralysed man. Watch the YouTube clip of Jesus healing the paralysed man and write a newspaper article on the event. https://bit.ly/36pGm7K	Jesus taught his followers that like him, they must show mercy and love by forgiving others. Jesus gave his followers the Sacrament of Penance, through which Jesus renews people's relationship with God and others. Create a 'What I Know' chart on the Sacrament of Penance.	There are some simple steps to receiving the Sacrament of Penance. Read through Activity Sheet 1 to learn these steps.
Week 3 We are learning that Corporal Works of Mercy make the world a better place	Jesus teaches people to forgive others and show love and mercy. Mercy means choosing to help others and not hurt them. List ways you, or people you know, might show mercy to others in their daily lives. Week 4 We are learning that the Church focuses on the Crucifixion of Jesus on Good Friday	On Good Friday God showed people just how extreme God's merciful love for people could be. The main focus for the Church on Good Friday is the Crucifixion of Jesus.  Watch: https://bit.ly/3rigLKw	On Good Friday, followers of Jesus think about how they will 'take up their crosses', not in a way that focuses on what is hard and hurtful, but in a way that focuses on God's love, mercy and forgiveness. Week 5 We are learning that the followers of Jesus focus on love, mercy and forgiveness during Lent  Lent is a time for people to reflect upon how they show mercy to others in different ways.  In a few sentences, reflect on how you may have shown, or be able to show, mercy to others during Lent.		Love is a wonderful human ability, an ability which, as it grows, can be powerful enough to lead people to show mercy and forgive those who hurt them.  Create a flyer to share the message that love can help lead people to being merciful.	In the name of Jesus, Catholics through works of mercy seek to make the world a better place.  Considering the Corporal Works of Mercy, list ways that Catholic agencies seek to make the world a better place.

### Receiving the Sacrament of Penance

#### **Examination of conscience**

People prayerfully think about what they have said or done that did not show God's love and mercy. They can freely come to Jesus who loves them very much and helps them to turn to God in the Sacrament of Penance.

#### Being sorry for sins

People tell God they are sorry for the times they did not act with love and mercy towards others.

#### Confession of sin

People tell the priest as simply and as honestly as possible about the times when love and mercy was not shown to others.

#### Receive penance given

People listen to the words of the priest as he guides and reminds them of God's love and mercy.

#### **Act of Contrition**

People ask God for forgiveness when they pray:

O my God, I am very sorry that I have sinned against you, because you are so good and with the help of your grace I will not sin again. Amen.

#### **Absolution**

People receive the forgiveness of sins as the priest extends his hand and says the words of absolution.

The priest speaks the following words:

God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God grant you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

#### Thanks be to God

People leave the confessional and thank God for his love and forgiveness and pray the prayers the priest gave them for a penance.

To visit the imprisoned	Those in prison and many other persons and their families suffer dangers to freedom. To shelter the homeless	Everyone needs shelter. # Take Up Your Cross

On Good Friday God showed people just how extreme God's merciful love for people could be. The main focus for the Church on Good Friday is the Crucifixion of Jesus. On this day, followers of Jesus think about how they will 'take up their crosses', not in a way that focuses on what is hard and hurtful, but in a way that focuses on God's love, mercy and forgiveness. People are encouraged to reflect on:

How will I forgive others, and who do I need to forgive? How can I ask for forgiveness? How can we love one another?
