We have also commenced reading our class novel, 'The Cabbage Patch Fib' by Paul Jennings.

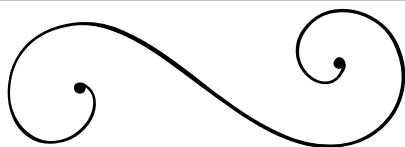
# From Mrs Landwehr -

  - Natural, managed and constructed

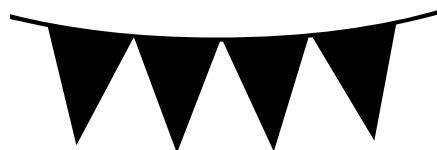
## LITERATURE (BOOK) ACTIVITIES
