- The school recently asked a local dairy family how we could best support them. Thank you to Vicki Fitzpatrick for the information. Get on board St Joes families!!
"The 3 dairy farms closest to Waroona, who all have family members at St Joseph's, all supply milk to Brownes! The best way to support local dairy farms is to buy branded milk (not 'home brand' like Coles or Woollies). The \$1/litre milk sales have taken about \$10 million from the industry since it was introduced. Ensure that all the dairy products (including yoghurts, creams, flavoured milks etc. you buy are from WA. WA imports more than half of the dairy products consumed here – around 400 million litres of milk or milk equivalents! This is pretty sad when there are farms going out of business here due to a supposed surplus of milk. Make sure you are getting your 3 serves of dairy every day.
