Educational Assistant in Kindergarten: I'd like to inform the school community that Mrs Bec Lorimer has been appointed as the second Educational Assistant in Kindergarten for the remainder of the school year. Mrs Lorimer's appointment is a direct result of Kindergarten enrolments exceeding 21 students. It is a CEWA regulation that a second Educational Assistant be employed if Kindergarten enrolment numbers are greater than 21. I know you will join me in congratulating Mrs Lorimer on her appointment.

Protective Behaviours: Last Friday, the staff attended a Protective Behaviours Professional Learning Day in readiness for the implementation of a Protective Behaviours Curriculum in Term 2. The day was so well received by the staff that I have been in communication with the facilitator to run a parent session in the not too distant future. Once formalities have been finalised, I will ensure parents have plenty of notice so they can attend the session. I encourage all parents to make the effort to attend this workshop as the facilitator and information presented is of the highest quality.

Unfortunately, due to the fire damage the shade sail has had to be removed and a replacement organised in readiness for the commencement of Term 4. It's a pity that we live in a society where senseless damage occurs, however, I am thankful no one was injured and no other structure was damaged. On a positive note, it is very heartening to hear the number of parents and community members mention to me that they keep an eye out on the school when driving or walking past.
