It was well received by our community with over 70 individual Easter egg prizes drawn. ANZAC Day Liturgy: The whole school will partake in an ANZAC Day Liturgy on Thursday 27th April at 11am. The Liturgy will be led by our Year 3 class. Everyone is also invited to the ANZAC Day Parade and Service to be held at the War Memorial commencing at 11.00am on Tuesday 25th April. Several of our senior students will lay a wreath on behalf of St Joseph's and recite a poem during the service

MJR Award: Congratulations to Ella Scally who is our recent MJR Award recipient. Ella was nominated by members of our school community for the following reason: Ella is a quietly spoken, kind-hearted girl who gets along with all her classmates and teachers. St Joseph's Feast Day Mass & Celebrations: On Monday 1st May, there will be a Whole School Mass led by the Year 2 class commencing at 11am in the Church to celebrate the Feast of St Joseph's. As part of this launch, I will be organising a certificate design competition for the whole school. Winning designs will be made into milestone certificates as previously mentioned.
