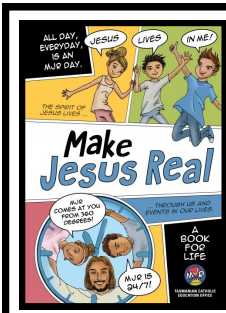

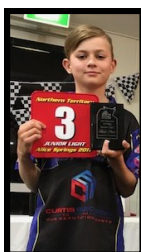
Congratulations

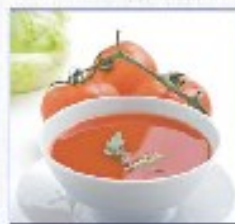

(Directed Drawing)

Focus on warm and cool colours

Focus on printmaking and drawing techniques
