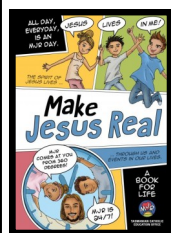
BEST Playground Resilience Tip



SPORT

Over the duration of Term 3, the students in PP-Year 6 were engaged in learning and practising skills for the recent School Athletics Carnival. Various sporting skills such as throwing, catching, jumping, running and team games were taught during Sport classes with the results being witnessed on carnival day.

Year 5 & 6 also learnt basic basketball skills during their Sport lessons during the later half of the term while PP-Year 4, participated in various games to develop their skills in strategy, good sportsmanship, cooperation, team-work, honesty and fair play.
