Most Sacred Heart of Jesus: Today we celebrate the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. The heart is what we associate with our deepest loves. Jesus' heart was pierced when the soldier lanced Jesus' side with his spear, on the cross. This action, which is described in scripture, made water and blood flow from Jesus' heart. First Eucharist Retreat: Today, the Year 4 class participated in their First Eucharist Retreat here at school. Mrs Poasa and I facilitated the day with wonderful support given by Fr. Wally. Parents joined the students in a Liturgy and afternoon tea at the end of the day.

4-Year Old Kindy Enrolment: Interviews will be occurring during Weeks 7 & 8 (11th-22nd June). Parents are asked to complete an enrolment application form and drop it into the school office if you have a child due to start Kindergarten in 2019. Eligible children would be born between 1 July 2014 and 30 June 2015. Families with siblings already enrolled in the school will still need to enrol children for 4-Year Old Kindergarten. Mrs Dwyer has begun contacting families regarding a Kindy interview date and time.

3 Year-Old Playgroup Enrolment: Parents are encouraged to enrol their child, if born between 1 July 2015 to 30 June 2016, into the 2019 program. Enrolment forms are available from the front office or the school website.

New PA System (Josephite Centre): Through the collective support between the school, parish and P&F, a new PA system has been installed in the Josephite Centre. This is a fantastic addition that will allow greater flexibility when the school, P&F and Parish hold events. The system will be used for the first time at the Year 3 Assembly.

Crisis Management Plan: The school has recently updated its Crisis Management Plan with staff being trained in using the new plan. You'll notice over the coming weeks the updated evacuation plans in all buildings within the school. The students will be taught what to do during an evacuation procedure.

P&F Meeting: All parents and friends are very welcome to attend the next P&F meeting on Tuesday, June 12th at 7pm. I look forward to seeing you all on Tuesday.

MJR Award: The next MJR Award will be announced on Friday 15th June following the Year 3 Assembly. Nomination forms can be found at the front office and in each classroom.

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Keeping imagination alive in Primary School kids

Kids spend most of the day in classrooms learning concepts and practising skills. But if you wander past the school at lunchtime, you'll see them gallivanting through the playground kicking a ball or setting up a "shop" in the sandpit.

Kids inherently want to roam and explore using their imagination, and we are keen to strengthen this practice at OSHC.

We make it a priority to "lighten up" as much possible, giving the kids a chance to tell us what activities they'd like to see in OSHC for the next week or month, rather than our team always setting the schedule. We think this approach not only enables kids to think freely and imaginatively but it also sparks their curiosity to learn more.

Some of the other ways we encourage imagination in OSHC include:

- Avoiding screens and encouraging interaction between the kids
- Going outside to the playground to let the kids lead games
- Building spaces, like imaginary forts or cafes using the equipment in the OSHC space
- Offering a box of LEGO, without any building instructions so the kids can create whatever they fancy
- Putting out art and craft activities and supervise as the kids create whatever they like!
