4-Year Old Kindergarten Enrolment: Thank you to those families who have met with me and had their Kindergarten enrolment interview for 2019. If there are still parents who have not yet filled in an enrolment application form and dropped it into the school office, can I please ask that you do so as soon as possible. If you have any friends or family interested, please tell them to contact the school. Eligible children would be born between 1 July 2014 and 30 June 2015. Families with siblings already enrolled in the school, will still need to enrol their child for 4-Year Old Kindergarten.

School Reports: On Wednesday 27 June, students in Years PP-6, will bring home their school report for Semester One. The Kindy class will also be bringing home a work portfolio. All the children have been working extremely hard throughout the semester and have achieved some very pleasing results. Please take the time to sit down and talk through the report with your child. We are all unique and it is important not to compare your child with other children in the classroom or even with siblings. Each person has their own strengths and areas for improvement. Please do not hesitate to contact your child's classroom teacher should you wish to meet with them following receipt of the school report.

Principal Review: Last Thursday, I had a meeting with the Acting Executive Director of CEWA, Debra Sayce, regarding my recent Principal Review. The meeting involved a discussion regarding my personal growth plan as per the recommendations identified in my report. I'd like to inform the St Joseph's community that I have had my contract extended for another 5 years and that I am sincerely thankful for the ongoing support and assistance the staff, students, parents and community provide me in my role. I am very honoured to be the Principal of this wonderful school and I look forward to the exciting challenges ahead.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: The Sacramental program for First Reconciliation will officially commence next Thursday 28th June, when the Year 3 students will attend a Sacramental retreat day at the Schoenstatt Shrine in Armadale. The Parent & Candidate Meeting will take place on Thursday 19th July at 6pm and the Commitment Mass will take place on Sunday 22nd July at 8:30am in the Church.

NAIDOC Liturgy: This year's NAIDOC Week falls during the school holidays (8th – 15th July). To acknowledge NAIDOC Week here at school, Mrs Gorman and Miss Baggetta will be organising a whole school Liturgy at 11am on Friday 29th June. The Aboriginal Playgroup students will also join us for the Liturgy and Brad Vitale and helpers from the Waroona Shire will be engaging our students in activities following the celebration. Students are allowed to come to school on this day wearing colours representing NAIDOC Week (black, red & yellow). This year's NAIDOC Week theme is "Because of her, we can!" which celebrates the invaluable contribution that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women have made – and continue to make – to the community and to the nation.

MJR Award: Congratulations to Craig Barr who was our recent MJR Award recipient. He was nominated by members of our school community for "displaying MJR qualities that assist in servicing our school community. Craig volunteers his time in a quiet manner and always with a smile upon his face. He has gone above and beyond in assisting those in need and is a wonderful example of a WESTIE. 
