"To ensure that your child/ren's school bus transport requirements are passed along to School Bus Services, it will be appreciated if you consider the following questions and take action where appropriate:

CHANGE TO CIRCUMSTANCES

- Is your child changing schools in 2019, including changing from primary school to high school and will need to catch the bus?
- Are you moving address before the 2019 school year commences?

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- Do you have an additional child that will require orange school bus transport for the first time in 2019?
- Does your child have a Medical Condition, or has their Medical Condition changed?

If you have answered YES to any of these questions you will need to submit a new application for Transport Assistance. This can be completed online through the SBS website at: <u>www.schoolbuses.wa.gov.au</u>.

You are not able to use the Change of Details form on the website in place of submitting a new application. New applications need to be submitted to SBS as soon as possible and preferably **no later than 8 October 2018**. Applications lodged after this date may not be processed in time for the 2019 year and in this case you may need to provide private transport. "

DigiTech (Digital Technology) Newsletter

This year has been a fantastic learning experience for all our students but in particular those from Year 1 to Year 6 who have had a dedicated Digital Technology lesson each week with Mrs Hodgson.

We have been able to use a variety of devices, apps and unplugged activities in our learning.

Activities have included some basic cybersafety where students learnt about the type of information that should never be shared on line, as well as some appropriate ways to act and behave on the internet.



We have a wonderful range of devices that students have been able to work with this year.



Year 1s and 2s were coding BeeBots to move around a lot of different mazes. They have been using CodeSpark Academy to help Foos look after their neighbourhood. While using this app they have learnt to sequence, write algorithms, create loops, identify bugs and debug programmes – all within a fun and collaborative approach.

Year 3s have learnt some block programming with Scratch Jr and were able to create their own animations and short stories.

Year 4s have been learning about block coding with Scratch and are now able to create a range of animations with action and sound.

The 3s and 4s are now working with Edison devices and will begin to use the block programming knowledge they have gained to programme these devices. A dance routine with the Edisons is on the cards for these students.



The 5s and 6s have been learning all about the things they can do with Spheros. I am extremely impressed with what they are able to do with the Spheros. Their project for this term will be to create a dance party with the Spheros.

DigiTech is not all about fun though as the Year 5s and 6s are learning as they are starting to



tackle Binary Code - a code used with computers and based on a base 2 number system.
