School Climate Survey – HAVE YOUR SAY:

Today an envelope is being sent home to all families to seek honest feedback about the climate of St Joseph's School, Waroona.

There are two ways of completing the survey, either online (code is in the envelope) OR by completing the paper form and returning it sealed in the envelope provided. The survey period is open from 21st May until 4th June.

Privacy is crucial and the surveys are confidential. NSI Partnerships manage the process to ensure no individual identifying data is released. Most of the questions are responses such as: Almost Never, Rarely, Sometimes, Often and Almost Always.

This survey is an opportunity for parents and caregivers to tell the school staff how things are going for you and your children.

As a school, we value your feedback and endeavour to respond to the information that all parents and guardians provide.

Student Voice:

We follow the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, which requires that children and young people are always provided the opportunity to participate in decisions that affect them. Our students will be given the opportunity also to have their say in the climate survey plus regularly via their student council and individual surveys.

More recently, our students were surveyed about having a cross country carnival this term, and there was limited support from the student body. We have listened to our students, and rather than have a cross country carnival we will have a talent show.

The student council will run heats at lunchtime for all students interested in the talent show and the finalists will get to perform at an assembly.

Respectful Relationships:

Pope Francis says as an essential requirement of love, "every human being is bound to live agreeably with those around him. Our roles as parents, guardians and professional educators is to model healthy, respectful relationships for our students so they will be equipped with the knowledge to understand how they should be treated".






New Staff Profile
